

# Ashtabula Municipal Court Annual Report for 2019

## Mission Statement

The Ashtabula Municipal Court shall be effective and efficient when resolving disputes in order to uphold the laws and regulations of the court's jurisdiction and the State of Ohio. The Judge will interpret and apply the law with the utmost fairness and impartiality in order to protect the rights and liberties of all people guaranteed by the Constitution of the State of Ohio and of the United States of America.

The Annual Report for the Ashtabula Municipal Court (AMC) is to notify the public about the Court's programs, statistics and accomplishments.

The AMC has one Judge, one Magistrate, one Court Administrator / Clerk of Court, one Head Bailiff/Head Security Officer, three part time Bailiffs (one of which works mainly outside of the Court serving Court documents), two part time Court Security Officers / Deputy Bailiffs that monitor the metal detector for the Justice Center building, and a part time Drug Court Administrator / Deputy Bailiff.

AMC departmentalized creating the following:

Criminal/Traffic Department, Civil Department, Probation Department, Bookkeeping/Customer Service Department, and Information Technology Department

The Criminal/Traffic Department consists of one Supervisor Deputy Clerk / Judicial Assistant, one full time Traffic Clerk, one full time Criminal Clerk and one part time Administrative Support Deputy Clerk.

#### BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE CRIMINAL/TRAFFIC DEPARTMENT

Methods were modified (or in the process of being modified) to increase efficiency of the Court. Methods established in prior years-such as birthday blocks and LFF payment plans-have continued to demonstrate successful collection of outstanding fines and costs. The Court staff scanned in all payment agreements with open accounts to create open space in the front window area; the Court has installed glass partitions at the window and will be placing an office partition to alleviate noise distraction for the Customer Relations department. All files that were on shelves are now in labeled boxes (placed in basement storage area) or scanned creating a neat and organized appearance to the public.

The Court held the Clean Sweep program for a week in March 2019. People had an opportunity to make a minimum payment of \$100 towards fines either at the Court or online, and the Court would match the payment. Total amount receipted was \$19,121.30; total Fresh Start credit was \$18,993.30. A total of 43 defendants participated.

The registration blocks and license forfeitures continue to be an effective method of collecting back fines. The LFF program is still offered to those who can't afford to pay balance in full. Total traffic/criminal monies receipted for the entire year was \$855,512.00 (a 12% decrease from 2018 total).

Total of new criminal and traffic cases filed: 6929 cases filed. Total of criminal cases disposed: 3033; total traffic cases disposed: 5597; for a grand total of 8630 cases disposed.

The Court has been conducting video arraignments for Ashtabula County Jail since the end of 2018 and has continued to do so thereafter, successfully reducing costs for transportation and freeing up deputies' valuable time.

In August 2019, the Court implemented a pilot program (at no cost to the Court) for hearing reminders via text and email. The pilot program was offered by eCourtDate, a company based out of Orlando, Florida. The goal of this program is to reduce the failure to appear rate and issuance of warrants. As of the end of the year, the company has provided 5,353 text reminders; 3,168 were

successfully received; 2,185 were unsuccessfully received; 521 defendants opted-in; 129 defendants opted-out.

A new docket schedule was implemented-effective September 27, 2019-to create a more smooth and streamlined daily docket and to reduce work stress at the counter. Initial results have been positive; clerks, attorneys, and the public seem receptive to the changes.

The Court continues to use its website and social media to keep the public notified of special programs, Court closings, and jury trial status updates. Notifying jurors in this manner has been very effective; people have the convenience of finding out about jury duty from their phones or computers without having to call in. This method also ensures up to date information as to whether they need to report or not-website and Facebook page are updated as soon as status changes.

The Court will continue in its mission to be effective and efficient. Improved Supreme Court case management numbers, increased BCI organization, increased collection of outstanding fines and costs, and decreased missed hearings are just a few goals on the horizon for year 2020.

Civil Department consisting of one full time Supervisor Civil Clerk and two full time Civil Clerks and one part time Civil Clerk.

#### A brief summary of the Civil Department from the Supervisor Deputy Clerk:

2019 was another productive year in the Civil Department. Although the number of case filings had a 6% decrease, the number of overall pleadings and post-judgments remedies increased by \$93,911 or 14%.

Garnishments had a huge increase in 2019, nearly \$75k, which also means poundage that the court keeps was almost doubled.

The number of emailed pleadings has increased over the course of 2019 which reduces the use of paper and postage.

Finally, the Civil Department has implemented new procedures for decreasing turn-around time in processing pleadings and eliminating backlog. Continuing with the Court's motto of being effective and efficient, the Civil Department's goal in the new year is to aim for a one-week turn-around on processing.

Probation Department consisting of one Chief Probation Officer, two full time Probation Officers and one part time Secretary.

#### A brief summary from the Recovery Court Administrator:

We currently have 22 participants, we graduated 7 in October 2019. We continue to meet weekly for Recovery Court, with the participants attending staggered depending upon the phase they are currently in. Treatment team continues to meet weekly, prior to Recovery Court. The Advisory Committee meets every 4 months.

Bookkeeping / Customer Relations department consisting of two full time customer relations clerk, and one full time bookkeeper/small claims deputy clerk.

Information Technology department consisting of one consultant Network Administrator.

Below shows AMC's progress:

- 1) Received an Ohio Supreme Court Technology grant for a state of the art metal detector which was the initial step in the Courts plan to secure the Justice Center Facility.
- 2) Used Court special project funds to install cameras around the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor Court area, to further our security plan.
- 3) Started receiving and processing electronic tickets from OSP.

# ANNUAL REPORT 2019 ASHTABULA ADULT PROBATION DEPARTMENT

On November 19, 2019 one officer at the Adult Probation Department began conducting home visits. Approximately 20 home visits were conducted. This will be a very beneficial component to the on-going supervision of clients, to the community and Ashtabula Municipal Court. The Ashtabula Municipal Court Adult Probation Department is here to make sure each client complies with the orders of the Court, but also to make sure the community is protected.

The opiate and severe drug addiction in this now is now being handled through Recovery Court. One Probation Officer has been assigned to the Recovery Court, which has been very successful. On October 10, 2019 the Recovery Court had its first graduation of 7 participants. At the end of 2019 we had 19 active participants in Recovery Court.

The Probation Department has continued with the collection of restitution. In an attempt to make all victims whole each defendant is required to report monthly to a Probation Officer to collect restitution payments. By instituting the required monthly reporting the restitution collection increased by \$5,000.00.

In 2019 the Court referred 104 individuals to the Probation Department to supervise community service. A total of 2,216.75 hours were completed.

## COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM
